## TIME LIMIT VIOLATIONS -.25

The routine time limit is 2:30. Routines that exceed this time limit run the risk of being assessed a deduction. Judges will use a stop watch/similar device to measure the official time. Acknowledging the potential variance caused by human reaction speed and sound system variations, judges will not issue a deduction until their clock /stopwatch shows a time that exceeds 2:32. Teams that exceed 2:30 by 1 or more seconds will be subject to a .25 deduction

## SAFETY VIOLATIONS

Building Skills Performed Out of Level	<b>1.0 Deduction</b>
Tumbling Out of Level or General Rules	<b>.50 Deduction</b>

Clarification: One deduction will be made for each rule violated in a section; not for each person/group violating the rule

## UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT DEDUCTION -1.0

When a coach is in discussion with an official, other coaches, athletes and parents/spectators they must maintain proper professional conduct. Failing to do so will result in a 1.0 deduction and removal of coach or disqualification. Includes the following:

- Inappropriate & deliberate physical contact between athletes during an event
- Abuse of equipment or any items associated with the event
- Using language or a gesture that is obscene, offensive, or insulting
- Using language or gestures that offend race, religion, colour, descent or national or ethnic origin
- Failing to perform a routine
- Excessive appealing at Score Review
- Showing dissent towards scoring official decision by word or action
- Threat of assault to an event representative
- Public criticism of an event related incident or event official

## BOUNDARY or IMAGE POLICY VIOLATIONS -.25

Boundary Violations: The performance surface is defined as the 42' x 54' competition floor. The competition boundary is defined as the performance surface and any immediate adjacent safety border. A .25 deduction will be assessed per occurrence for an athlete that makes contact with both feet outside the competition boundary. Stepping on, or just past the white tane is not a boundary violation.

Image Policy Violations: Inappropriate choreography, uniform and/or music, as well as violations that break the image policy will be issued a .25 deduction.

## ATHLETE FALL - 0.25

Drops to performance surface during tumbling and/or jump skills

- Hand, hands or head down in tumbling or jump skills
- Knee or knees down in tumbling or jumps

## BUILDING FALL - 0.75

Drops to a cradle and/or load position from a stunt, pyramid or toss

- Base or spotter drops to the floor during a building skill

## MAJOR BUILDING FALL - 1.25

Drops to the floor from a stunt, pyramid or toss by a top person and/or the bases/spotters (i.e. Top person drops to floor; multiple bases and/or spotters drop to floor; top person lands on base and/or spotter who drops to the floor, etc).

## MAXIMUM - 1.75

When multiple deductions should be assessed during a stunt or toss (by a single group), or during a pyramid sequence, then the sum of those deductions will not be greater than 1.75. During pyramids where a fall continues to effect other portions of the pyramid, teh deduction will not exceed 1.75. TWO separated pyramids will result in separate deductions. The MAX deduction for a pyramid will not exceed 3.5.

## MINIMUM ATHLETE REQUIREMENT - 5.0

Teams that register and compete with fewer than the minimum number of athletes will either be moved to the correct division or issued a 5 point deduction. Teams that register with the correct number of athletes but compete with fewer will not be assesd a deduction. Judging: ALL teams will be scored as if they meet the minimum number of athletes (majority & most) and will not be eligible for bids to any end of season events.

## TIE BREAKING STEPS (In Priority Order)

1. The team with least total deductions will be placed above the other team(s)
2. The team with least legality deductions will be placed above the other team(s)
3. The team with highest total execution score will be placed above the other team(s)
4. If a tie still exists, the judges will be polled. Majority rules. All judging decisions are final.
